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Sirinya Surina Declares:

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1. I am the Petitioner and mother of David and Andrew Surina.
2. Thailand Assets. We do not have any assets in Thailand. This is a distraction that Respondent continues to bring before the court. When I submitted my first Financial Declaration, I inadvertently omitted a bank account that I had in Thailand for the purpose of receiving payments on a loan from a friend. I amended my declaration to include the account, which had a balance of \$1,500.00 US. I have subsequently paid these funds toward my mounting attorney fees. See Exhibit A a true and correct copy of a receipt for these monies paid. Respondent removed several documents and personal property from our home over several months as part of his plan to divorce me. He has several Thai documents that include my person genealogy and personal immigration documents that he refuses to turn over to me. The insurance or annuities referred to in the email threads attached to Respondent's responsive declaration are incorrectly translated.

1 3. It is my recollection that this policy was on the life of my grandmother, Gosum Garoensap.
2 Respondent and I paid 89,575 baht, which is \$2,800 US to bring it current in 2014. My
3 grandmother cashed in the policy in 2017 because she couldn't afford to keep up the
4 premium payments. The court should note that the value of what he is alleging, with no
5 evidence is stated in Thai currency, which presently exchanges at 32 baht per \$1 US
6 depending on the value on the day of exchange.

7 4. Tax Filing. Respondent offers his tax returns after it is too late for the court to make a
8 comparison of the most effective way to file our 2017 tax return. It is my information that
9 married filing jointly provides the most economic benefit to us.

10 5. Once again I am forced to defend on a motion to modify the court's order, which is not
11 properly before the court due to no substantial change of circumstances. I am also forced
12 to file a motion regarding tax information to enforce the Court's order entered at the
13 beginning of our case August 14, 2017.
