This dissolution lasted for 28 months and was difficult on everyone involved.

Judge Price is significantly increasing the time of the boys with their father in this order.

In the process of this case, respondent allegedly has engaged in abusive use of conflict along with the petitioner which has involved the children in some manner. This would be contrary to the children's best interests.

Temporary limitations on decision making and communicating between parties are 1 year restrictions listed below starting on 12/1/2019.

The court can only order Shared Decision Making with a history of cooperation. Judge Michael Price to re-evaluate after 1 year.

The court, received "credible reports of abuse and neglect" relating to the Petitioner's parenting. Commissioner Nichole Swennumson issued an order for immediate

Guardian Ad Litem due to these "credible reports" in March of 2018. Petitioner's Counsel petitioned the trial Judge and moved the case to Judge Hazel. After moving to Judge Hazel, the Petitioner's counsel moved the court to order the Respondent to undergo examination and evaluation in place of the petitioner.

Respondent followed the judges orders and scored very high and was deemed a fit parent with no risk to his children through the administration of AAPI-2 adult adolescent exam. This court considers this exam "the gold standard".

The court has "credible" facts or findings in reports of abuse and neglect while the children are with the petitioner.

The court was unable to obtain court ordered evaluation the petitioner.

Anyone with majority or substantially equal residential time (at least 45 percent) who wants to move with the children **must notify** every other person who has court-ordered time with the children.

Move to a different school district

If the move is to a different school district, the relocating person must complete the form *Notice of Intent to Move with Children* (FL Relocate 701) and deliver it at least **60 days** before the intended move.

Exceptions:

- If the relocating person could not reasonably have known enough information to complete the form in time to give 60 days' notice, s/he must give notice within **5 days** after learning the information.
- If the relocating person is relocating to a domestic violence shelter or moving to avoid a clear, immediate and unreasonable risk to health or safety, notice may be delayed **21 days**.
- If information is protected under a court order or the address confidentiality program, it may be withheld from the notice.
- A relocating person who believes that giving notice would put her/himself or a child at unreasonable risk of harm, may ask the court for permission to leave things out of the notice or to be allowed to move without giving notice. Use form *Motion to Limit Notice of Intent to Move with Children (Ex Parte)* (FL Relocate 702).

The *Notice of Intent to Move with Children* can be delivered by having someone personally serve the other party or by any form of mail that requires a return receipt.

- Phone Contact of Children – No parent to child or child to parent phone calls while the child is with the other parent
- No Communication of parent to parent in person, email, text or phone calls except noted emergency phone call or My Family Wizard Communication.
- Aaron to remain 1 City Block from Home, school or Work of Sirinya – except for pick up or drop off of children – this is only a restriction with the court of Judge Price. It is not a law enforcement restriction.
- Verifiable Emergency - Parents can communicate.
